

How do you keep up with all of the rules?
Below are just a few things companies, drivers and vehicles need.

## **Company**

• BOC-3:

You must designate a process agent in each state where you maintain an office or establish contracts.

- DOT Number:
  - Used by the U.S. Dept. of Transportation to monitor your safety record. Must be displayed on the truck
- Drug & Alcohol Clearinghouse:
   To report drug and alcohol violations.
- Heavy Vehicle Use Tax:
   Paid for all trucks 55,000 pounds or more

using Form 2290. Payment is needed before the MVA will issue your license plates.

- Insurance:
  - Coverages vary based on what you haul, but minimum liability is \$750,000.
- International Fuel Tax Agreement (IFTA):
  To pay your fuel taxes if you drive in multiple states. Trucks must have an IFTA decal.
- International Registration Plan (IRP): If operating in multiple states you need an apportioned registration license plate.
- Motor Carrier Identification Report:
   Motor carriers with DOT numbers must update their MCS-150 at least every two years.
- Operating Authority:

All for-hire carriers must have authority to haul freight across state lines.

• Unified Carrier Registration: Needed if you travel outside Maryland.



## **Drivers**

- Commercial Drivers' License (CDL): Needed for vehicles over 26,000 lbs. Gross Vehicle Weight Rating.
- Drug & Alcohol Testing:
   All CDL drivers need to be in a random drug/alcohol testing pool.
- Medical Qualification:
   Drivers operating a commercial motor vehicle over 10,000 lbs. must be medically qualified a minimum of every two years or less.
- Motor Vehicle Record:
   Companies must pull a driver's motor vehicle record every year.

## **Vehicles**

Preventive Maintenance (PM):
 MD commercial vehicles must be inspected and repaired every 12 months or 25,000 miles, whichever comes first.
